



Telford is a major urban area that is set in substantial rural hinterland. Established in the 1960's as a New Town, Telford consists of market towns, smaller district centres and historic Ironbridge, a UNESCO world heritage site.

The central location and excellent transport links in Telford ensure that travelling to the rest of England is simple as the M54 corridor runs through the town to the M6. The road network also provides good access to north and mid-Wales. Telford sits on a direct train line to Birmingham and there are daily direct trains to London. Travelling within Telford is also easy, not only by car as there is little congestion on the roads but also the public bus network provides good links across the town.

To access Telford: if you are travelling from the south leave the M6 at junction 10a for the M54. If you are travelling from the north leave at junction 11 for the A5 to Telford or A460 (to join at M54 junction 1).
